Flat Shod Walking Shoeing Regulations:

Trail Pleasure: "3/8 x 3/4" maximum

Country Pleasure: "3/8 x 1" maximum

Keg Shod County Pleasure: "3/8 x 3/4" stamped keg shoe

Lite-Shod Pleasure: "1/2 x 1" maximum

Plantation Pleasure: "1/2 x 1 ½" maximum

-Tungsten Shoes are prohibited in ALL Trail and Country Pleasure Divisions.

-No bare plate or other weight inside the shoe.

- -The caulk must not exceed one inch turn back (one and a half inch on plantation shoes) and the shoe must not extend more than 1/4 inch beyond the hoof at the toe.
- -The heel of the shoe must not extend beyond the bulb of the horse's heel when a perpendicular line is drawn from the bulb of the horse's heel to the ground.
- -The use of borium is permitted on the caulks of the pleasure shoes, but the thickness of the shoe and caulk with the borium must not exceed 1 1/8 inches.
 - -No additional weight shall be allowed on or in the hoof, other than the shoe and nails.

Note:

Horse Show Managers may have any class, or shoe specifications, they desire. However, it must be stated in the show program or expressed to the KY-HIO DQP's before inspection.

Anytime a Show Manager has a class different than these shoeing rules, they will apply for that show only and will not count for High Points in KWHA.
